Over the Easter break, we will be sending home a revision pack. This will include a range of Maths, Reading and SPaG activities to support your child with their SATs revision. When Year 6 return to school after half term, they will have less than three weeks before SATs begin. For every piece of revision work your child completes, they will earn one raffle ticket for our prize hamper! Please note, children should be able to complete their pack independently as the activities are merely revision.

Uniform
