



Art and Design at St. Stephen's CE Primary school



At St Stephen's, the Art and Design curriculum has been designed to actively engage and stimulate children's creativity whilst developing a range of high-quality skills in the Arts. This leads children to become competent and confident in the skills of drawing, painting and sculpture, as well as in using a wide range of techniques and materials.

At St Stephen's, Art and Design is taught from reception through to Year 6.

The following outcomes are expected at the end of KS1:

- to use a range of materials creatively to design and make products
- to use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination
- to develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space
- to learn about the work of a range of artists, craft makers and designers, describing the differences and similarities between different practices and disciplines, and making links to their own work.

In addition to above, the following outcomes are expected at the end of KS2:

- to create sketch books to record their observations and use them to review and revisit ideas
- to improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of different materials
- to learn about great artists, architects and designers in history.
