## **Context**

The PE team (OL, RC and JS) have the responsibility for developing PE, School Sport and Physical activity within the school and deciding the effective use of Sport Premium funding. St Stephens Primary School have got an excellent reputation for delivering high-quality sport provision in school, attending numerous competitions, offering a wide range of after school clubs and providing opportunities for all to take part in physical activity throughout the academic year. At St Stephens Primary School, our vision is to provide engaging opportunities for children to experience high quality physical education and school sport through personal challenge and competition that will lead to lifelong participation. We are also committed to ensuring that we follow the guidance given around Covid 19 to ensure that our PE curriculum contributes to improving both mental and physical health. This includes getting pupils back to a broad and balanced PE curriculum as well as extra-curricular activities when it is deemed safe to do so.

Our key achievements to date include:

- Providing early years children with the equipment and lessons to learn to ride a bike in the 'progression to pedals' scheme
- Engaging children in numerous competitions with other schools (not since March 2020)
- High levels of participation in extra-curricular active clubs
- Links with local sports clubs and Lancashire Cricket Club
- Engage children as playground leaders
- Teacher's professional development, skills and confidence in coordinating PE provision as a result of specific training
